

RESOLUTION NO. 1005

CITY OF LACEY

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY FOR THE REMEDIATION OF AN ODOR
CONTROL FACILITY.

WHEREAS, the City's wastewater system includes odor control facilities, and

WHEREAS, these facilities are located at various places throughout the City, and

WHEREAS, the City primarily uses a product named Bioxide for odor control in its
wastewater system, and

WHEREAS, this product is contained in large tanks at the odor control facilities, and

WHEREAS, it has been discovered that the contents from a 1,500 gallon tank of Bioxide
has leaked into the ground, and

WHEREAS, this product has been defined as a hazardous substance by Department of
Ecology regulations, and

WHEREAS, Public Works staff has been communicating with the Department of Ecology
to keep them informed of the status of the cleanup, and

WHEREAS, Department of Ecology regulations specify that appropriate immediate action
be taken to protect human health and the environment,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
LACEY, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:


1. The City Council hereby finds and declares that an emergency exists requiring the
City to move forward with remediation of an odor control facility located at the southwest corner of
Avonlea Park adjacent to Ingleside Loop SE and that the time for advertising and awarding a public

bid for such work could negatively impact the environment.


2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with a qualified contractor to proceed with the remediation of the odor control facility as described above without the necessity of calling for public bids or formal bid award by the City Council.


