

LACEY HISTORICAL COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

CALENDAR OF EVENTS

- a) September History Talks!
Captain Cook Rediscovered will be September 8 at 6:30 pm. Moving forward the talks will be a hybrid model, both in-person and live streaming. October's talk is Hanford History project. Ms. Quinn Valcho encouraged all to attend.

OLD BUSINESS

- a. New Museum project. July 30, Staff met with Salmon Safe team and confirmed many of the requirements need to obtain certification.
Next Steps: Salmon Safe will outline conditions for Salmon Safe certification, then they will formalize the agreement that the City will comply with the conditions for the 5-year certification. Then it can be publicized. Salmon Safe will check in with the City annually.

Voluntary cleanup program at new museum site started July 13 and finished August 18. It was expected to take 4 weeks but went about 1 week late. All of the contaminated soils are gone and the hole is filled with compacted crushed rock. A monitoring well is getting installed per DOE and will remain for the next

year. Ms. Goetz provided information on the financial obligations of monitoring wells. Ms. Quinn Valcho will pass this information onto Ms. Burbidge. Mr. Ebel asked where the soils were being disposed of. Ms. Burbidge will report back at next meeting.

Lacey Depot.

Report from Justin Beard: The Depot has a total of 7 reservations on the calendar from July-September, bringing in \$800.00 in fees as of today. In addition to the private rentals on the weekends, Jeannette and Jordy put on a "Concert in the Park" and the site is also host to the Food Truck Depot throughout the weekdays. When not rented it is available for drop-in use and most days you'll find the train themed playground full of kids playing and families enjoying a picnic in the Depot. The feedback received up to this point has all been positive and people are really enjoying everything available.

b. Tribal Relations-event in Sept.

- **Squaxin Island Tribe.** Most community events are through the museum. The Museum re-closed as of August 3.
 - Squaxin Island Tribe Museum Fundraiser, Saturday, September 21, \$75/ticket
- **Nisqually Tribe.** Events on their website are clearly marked if they are open to the public.
 - Included items in the packet which are listed as public.
 - Many tribal events are being postponed to prevent the potential spread of COVID-19.
 - Nisqually Wellbriety Pow-Wow, Sept. 24-26. Commissioners discussed the level of participation by the Commission. It was decided that Commissioners Ebel, Huff, and Tyler would each attend on one of the days of the event and report back.
